

The successful rescue of the Painted Desert Trading Post has ensured that this historic landmark will continue to stand for decades, barring acts of God. The Co-Op has since repaired the exterior stucco, restored the window frames, enhanced the ghosted lettering on the outside walls, and made other cosmetic improvements, all with an eye on maintaining its vintage patina.




